This training will include community partners who frequently interface with the homeless population

Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 41-21-131, a "CIT Officer" means a law enforcement officer who is authorized to make arrests under Section 99-3-1 and who is trained and certified in crisis intervention and who is working for a law enforcement agency that is a participating partner in a Crisis Intervention Team. **CIT Training Goals:**

- Ensure the safety of officers and civilians;
- Increase officer understanding of mental illness;
- Improve relationships with the community, particularly with mental health professionals, people with mental illness, and family members.

MS House Bill 1222: EACH MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO HAVE AT LEAST ONE CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINED OFFICER BY A CERTAIN DATE.

The CIT for Law Enforcement concept is based on a successful crisis intervention program that began in Memphis, Tennessee.

CIT is conducted by specially trained law enforcement personnel, mental health professionals, mental health consumers and family advocates. The training includes identification of types of mental illness, verbal skills for de-escalation of potentially violent situations, specifics on suicide intervention, and a mental health system overview.

Graduation:

Dress Code: Graduates should wear or bring their official dress uniform for graduation (time will be available to change before the ceremony).

- Deadline to register for CIT training is Monday April 15, 2024
- Qualifications for Law enforcement: Full-time certified law enforcement officers with a minimum of one year of law enforcement experience. If you do not meet these criteria, please consider signing up for our free 8 hour Mental Health First Aid training for public safety and first responders
- Participants must attend the <u>full</u> 40 hours of training to graduate and receive CIT certification. <u>No</u> **exceptions**. Class will start promptly at 8:00 a.m. and dismiss at 5:00 p.m. daily. **Seats are limited**
